Our club was founded in 1964 shortly after the construction of Spruce Run Reservoir, with the permission of the State of New Jersey. This year we are continuing in our mission to provide a fun and safe environment in which to enjoy and share our passion for sailing.

We have a full schedule planned for the year with two major themes: One is the continuity of our racing programs throughout the season which include Sunday fleet racing, Wednesday night Sunfish racing, and special events like the Bluenose, Millard Fillmore, Little Brown Jug and, of course, the Commodore's Cup! ## The HSC Fleets:

Interested in joining the Hunterdon Sailing Club? There is a sailing fleet for everyone!  
Here is a quick overview of our most active fleets:



### Cruising Fleet / Open Fleet:

The Cruising Fleet is a social fleet for skippers who wish to sail in a relaxed, non-competitive atmosphere. The goals of the fleet are to encourage recreation among the members, foster a feeling of good will and friendship, promote safe boating, and further the art and science of sailing.

Members in the Open Fleet may also race competitively in Sunday racing and other Club events and regattas using the Portsmouth Handicapping System.

### Flying Scot Fleet:

The Flying Scot (pictured at right) is a 19-foot day sailer with more than 100 fleets throughout North America. The large cockpit is ideal for family sailing, providing safe, comfortable sailing for up to 8 people. If your interest is racing, a crew of 2 or 3 will find the Scot a great boat for competition at all levels. The sail plan consists of main, jib and spinnaker. The Scot's simple rigging and stable design appeal to beginners, while uniform construction fosters tactical racing for experienced sailors. ### Jet 14 Fleet:

The Jet-14 (pictured at left), developed in 1955, is a 14-foot, planing, one-design, two-person racing dinghy. The rig and sail plans are based on the Snipe, with spinnaker added in 1970. The design has proven to be rugged and long-lived with early wooden hulls still competitive against newer fiberglass hulls. The balance is such that crew weight and athletic ability are not critically important with the result that sailors aged 14 to over 70 can be competitive at all regatta levels. **Sunfish Fleet:**

The Sunfish (pictured at right) needs little introduction as its total number of boats exceeds 500,000. The boat is 13'10" long and has a hull weight of 139 pounds. The boat is raced single-handed or with a crew of 2. She is an ideal trainer for juniors, as well as an exciting boat for the avid racer. The Sunfish is the largest fleet at HSC, and is the boat used for the Club's sail training programs. In addition to Sunday racing, the Sunfish fleet also holds a Twilight racing Series on Wednesday evenings (pictured below).

**Force 5 Fleet:**

The Force 5 (pictured at right and below) is a powerful, single-handed racing dingy. Although one person races the boat, the cockpit is large enough to accommodate two people and provide ample day-sailing enjoyment. This 14' craft has a 91 square-foot mainsail, rolled deck and an adjustable rig. It is easily car topped.

**Albacore Fleet:**

The Albacore is a swift and powerful 15' one-design racing dinghy. Its rounded, planing hull combined with large sail area, advanced rigging and control surfaces enables the Albacore to perform exceptionally well in a variety of sailing conditions from gale force winds to gentle breezes. The Albacore is safe enough for a novice to sail with confidence, yet a definite challenge for the experienced sailor. More info:

Fleet 184 was founded 10 years ago and has thrived! We have been HSC's "Fleet of the Year" for the last 2 seasons, which says a lot given the other enthusiastic fleets and great sailors on the water at Spruce Run. This season we have a fun-filled, exciting, and family friendly schedule planned with events ranging from club racing on our home waters, fun cruising events on Spruce Run, the 10<sup>th</sup> year of the Challenge of The Lakes with Nockamixon Sailing Club, and a new distance cruising event planned for August 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>, the Scot Soirée.

The Flying Scot Soirée is going to be something different for many of the Flying Scot members. We are planning to launch our Scots at Raritan Yacht Club on August 25<sup>th</sup> and sail to Atlantic Highlands, returning on the 26<sup>th</sup>. The fleet will be chaperoned by the Nackmans sailing on *Blue Note*, a Bristol 43.3, providing a safety boat. We will anchor behind the breakwater at the Atlantic Highlands and will use the Atlantic Highlands Yacht Club launch to head into town. Atlantic Highlands has many great restaurants, a movie theater, an ice cream parlor and more. Lodgings are available at the Blue Bay Inn, a short walk from the waterfront. Activities may include swimming and a fleet barbecue at Horseshoe Cove on Sandy Hook, dinner in Atlantic Highlands and much more! This will be a great adventure. Raritan Bay is a great place to sail, with many possible cruising stops. (<http://www.charts.noaa.gov/OnLineViewer/12327.shtml>) Outside the shipping channels, the water is usually less than 10 feet, so there is not a lot of commercial traffic to worry about. For those members that are somewhat hesitant, this will be a great way to improve your confidence. We will have several meetings to discuss charts, navigation and communication.
