## Sunfish Fleet - Regattas (Save the Dates!)

The first SANJL regatta will be held on May 14<sup>th</sup>, there is a fee of \$15 for the day and \$40 for the series for seniors. The Youth entry fee for sailors who will not turn 19 or older by the end of 2010 is \$5 for the day and \$15 for the series. This includes a continental breakfast. Trophies will be awarded to the top finishers in both the Championship Fleet and the Challenger fleet. It is up to the discretion to the skipper which fleet they sail in. Four races are targeted for the day.

The rest of the series will be held at Swartzwood Lake on May 21<sup>st</sup> with 2 more regattas held in the fall, one at Highland Lakes on September 17<sup>th</sup> and the final one at Green Pond on October 1<sup>st</sup>. Series trophies will be awarded at the last event. You must have sailed at least 8 races in order to qualify for the series.



On May 30<sup>th</sup> the club will host the Memorial Day Regatta, the skipper's meeting will be at 10:00, there will be \$10 entry fee to cover a continental breakfast and trophies. This is an open regatta so both club members and non-club members can participate.

The full schedule for the Sunfish class will be posted shortly on the class website at <u>www.sunfishclass.org</u>. Highlights for this region are the Howard Griswold Regatta at Green Pond on July 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> and the three regional events: June 25-26 at Lewes YC; August 6-7 in Gloucester Virginia and August 20-21 at Avalon YC. In addition there is a regatta at Brandt Beach on June 11<sup>th</sup> and the Nationals at Barrington YC on July 20-24.

As the new Sunday Sunfish Fleet captain, I thought it would be fun to give you a little of my sailing background. I started sailing at Severn Sailing Association in Annapolis, MD when I was about 9. Every summer for 8 weeks, my brothers and I went to the SSA club house and sailed the Turtles and 420's. This lasted for about five years. At the time, and still today, SSA was a small boat racer's haven and heaven. I progressed through the levels Seaman, Mate I, Mate II, Skipper 1, and Skipper 2. There was one more level, Racing Skipper. Racing was an integral part of the program from the level of Seaman on. I think my parents got tired of sending us and thus I ended up missing the last year, Racing Skipper. One year I was awarded Most Improved Girl and still have an engraved plaque to show for it.


After five years of training I went to Annapolis Sailing School and taught adults and families on the boats, including the Cal 25 which they used at the time. My father had bought us Lanavier 420's and a Sunfish when I was in the SSA program. He unfortunately sold these boats so I currently have no boat! I sailed the race equipped 420 mainly at SSA. But we also had a nice Sunfish at home which I would sail from the house on the Chesapeake Bay. I think my father had it when I took the Sunfish with my boyfriend one day, sailed over to Dobbins Island (in the Magothy River), got caught in a storm, sailed over to his other boat at the marina in Deep Creek and broke the lock on the hatch to get in out of the storm. My sailing adventures have taken me to the Port of La Guaira, Venezuela and Bonaire, Netherland Antilles when I skippered a 50 foot steel hulled ketch in the Caribbean Sea north of South America, seeing the Southern Cross in the night sky. Sailing is a wonderful part of my life and I hope it continues to be.

I also decided that I would try to write an article on some aspect of the Sunfish every month. I may cover the history, new technologies on the rigging, and the fleet activities on national or international levels just to see what's going on. ## **How Do You Pronounce** Foc's'le?

The name of HSC's newsletter, The Foc's'le, is sometimes mispronounced even by some long-time club members. The Foc's'le takes its name as an abbreviated version of the word 'forecastle,' which on old sailing ships was the raised structure in the bow where the crew lived and no doubt shared tales, rumors, and scuttlebutt.



The dictionary says to pronounce it: *fok-s***a** 

However, for those of us who have yet to master formal dictionary pronunciation symbols, here are two possibilities.

Version 1. Start with a clear and assertive 'foe' -- as in friend or foe--- followed without pause, by a tiny 'k' sound on the end of that syllable. The second syllable is pronounced like 'sull' but try to rhyme it with 'bull' and not 'hull.'

Version 2. Another way to think of it is to say the word 'folk,' but making sure the silent 'L' is really silent, followed by 'stle' as in castle, this time making sure the silent 'T' also remains silent.
