challenge for my limited

Jay's (Halsted) Excellent Adventure with his New Force 5

Sold for \$325.!" Were the words I heard at the 2009 Annual HSC Dinner for the auction of a Force 5 complete with a trailer in sailing



condition. I was absolutely gave me pause was the thought added yet another vessel to our to retrieve the boat and observed condition at one time. weather had taken its toll, which



delighted and the only thing that of telling my wife that we had fleet. The next weekend I went that it had indeed been in sailing Unfortunately 10 years out in the translated to a project and a bo'sun skills. Surveying the yacht

with Rich Baumann, we observed that most of the spars were serviceable, the hull could possibly be repaired and the wood was basically toast. West Marine and Weeks Boatyard were clearly in my future...

I put the boat aside and began with the trailer, stripping it to the metal and rebuilding in its former image. The Force 5 manual was helpful and the hull support template was spot-on for cutting the new wood support pieces. With a new set of wheel bearings and a few cans of Rustoleum, the trailer was ready to roll. I was still daunted by the hull project until I got a call from Rich, mid Summer, saying that he had found a Force 5 give-away from a gentleman in New York. So, off we went for a road test of the re-fitted trailer. This boat had also been stored outside and the best news was that the wood and spars were in fairly good shape. We were able to combine the best of the two hulls to create a fairly complete inventory of wood, hardware and rigging required to complete the project. We were also able to donate the extra spars & parts back to HSC for the shed.







The rest of the project was pure elbow grease, West System epoxy, fiberglass, gel coat, sandpaper, saws, screws and Valspar. I hung the Force 5 in my garage bay which afforded protection from the elements and mobility to turn the hull at various angles for the repairs. This came in very handy for the bailer repair – also out of the Force 5 handbook. Once started, the project came together fairly quickly in "project time" – but much longer overall with life's other commitments, like family, work and sailing. The newly refitted Force 5 made its debut on the last day of the HSC sailing season, literally, for the last race of the season. It was quite breezy that day and the boat performed well. The skipper, however, could use some work on his Force 5 sailing skills which is on-tap for the upcoming season.





Force 5 Fleet 36 has a long history with the Hunterdon Sailing Club. For most of its life, it has been the largest



Force 5 fleet in the world. For many years, it was one of the most active. Right now, we have about 18 boats, but not so many active sailors. Here's the plan to change that status:

Tom Oryniak and I have decided to write a series of articles covering class legal, inexpensive boat alterations directed at Force 5 owners during the Spring. When the season gets going, we'll begin a series of on land and on water clinics covering sail trim and boat handling in various wind conditions. We'll also provide post race coaching throughout the season. Our aim is to make every boat equal and every sailor better.

So let's start with my observations about some boats that I sailed during the Bluenose Challenge. I noticed a loose dagger board in one boat that would not stay all the way down upwind or where I wanted it off wind. It just didn't fit tightly enough and water was sloshing up from the well into cockpit. The solution I use is to pack the bottom of the of the dagger board well with fiberglass reinforced body putty. Regular body putty works, but tends to crack out in a couple of years. Check the photo at the right. To do this, put in the board while wrapped with waxed paper taped to hold the paper in place. Turn the boat upside down and make sure that the board is



all the way into the slot and is perfectly centered in the boat. Secure that centering with a line to each side so that it won't move while working. Work fast, as body putty dries quickly. When dry, remove board and make sure that it slides up and down easily. Sand the inside of the slot if needed. Then at the upper end of the slot, I'm currently using foam padding after trying a rubber gasket for a few years. You can also glue in some carpeting to keep the board from wobbling side to side.

I also noticed that some control lines slipped through their cleats. The stock boat is delivered with some sort of plastic clam cleats that last about one season. I've replaced those with aluminum cleats that last at least 10 years.

Finally, I noticed a big difference among boats in the Bluenose with respect to the universal joint connecting the tiller to the tiller extension. One was not actually a "universal." A couple did not

provide a solid feel. I prefer the type shown at the left. They provide a complete range of motion, and solid feel. They do, however, start to crack after a few years and must be inspected often.

More to come.

New DMV Rules on Trailer Stickers Change Documents Required for Parking Slip Application.

You may have seen the "andygram" about this, but it's important for those who are renting boat parking slips at Spruce Run.

The DMV, as of August, will no longer provide a yearly decal for your trailer plate. If you will be a renting space you must provide a copy of a current trailer registration as part of the application. Failure to provide will cause your application to be rejected (go to the end of the line and hope that there's a space available when you return.) If you haven't renewed your registration yet, please do so.

As Park Liaison, I have asked about those who don't leave their trailers at the Park, and those who use someone else's trailer to transport their boat and dolly. An "andygram" will come when I have the answer.
