Simple Rules to Sail By...

For the Beginner:

- 1. The best way to learn to sail is to sail
- 2. Point the boat in the direction you want to go
- 3. Ease the sail until it is luffing, then pull in a bit
- 4. Put down the centerboard going upwind
- 5. Pull up the board going down wind
- 6. On a reach, put it in the middle
- 7. Try to keep the boat flat
- 8. In a puff, ease your sail, hike out and then trim it back in
- 9. Starboard tack has right of way
- 10. Windward boat keeps clear of leeward boat
- 11. A boat behind another must keep clear of the boat ahead of it
- 12. Don't start until it's your turn
- 13. Make sure you know the course
- 14. Around a mark, the inside boat usually has right of way
- 15. If you hit someone, say you're sorry and do a 720 spin
- 16. If you hit a mark, do a 360 spin and laugh
- 17. Ask questions, we are not judgmental
- 18. Don't be frustrated, laughter is better than yelling
- 19. A bad day on the water is better than a good day on land

For the Experienced:

- 1. The best way to improve your skills is to sail: focus on tactics, sail trim and balance
- 2. Be kind to beginners, offer advice on and off the water
- 3. Constantly review the racing rules
- 4. Protest with a smile
- 5. If you hit someone, say you're sorry and do a 720 spin
- 6. If you hit a mark, do a 360 spin and laugh
- 7. Don't be frustrated, laughter is better than yelling
- 8. A bad day on the water is better than a good day on land

HSC Commodore's Cup

Bring your favorite boat and crew to join us for the *Commodore's Cup on Saturday, June 9th.*

This regatta was established in 1969 to find the outstanding skipper in the Hunterdon Sailing Club. <u>Any boat</u> in the HSC fleet can sail in the Commodore's Cup regardless of model and class and can have an equal chance of winning!

The race committee will apply the Portsmouth Rating system (described on page 17 of the HSC Handbook) to level-the-playing-field. All boats will start at the same time as one "fleet" and the actual elapsed time for each boat will be adjusted to determine the winning placement. This means that the first boat to cross the finish line is not necessarily the winner!

So bring any boat in your fleet along with your family & friends and join us on June 9th. There will be refreshments at 10:30; skippers' meeting at 11am and the starting horn will sound at about Noon. 'See you there.


