"They definitely improved with each race," Gordon said afterwards. "Especially starting - after the first race, they stayed closer to the line and looked for their chance to start with clean air and good speed."

Winds were from the south to southwest and occasionally even reached 8 - 9 mph. After a brief talk covering the basics of right of way, starting, mark rounding and finishing, the sailors hoisted sail and headed for the starting area. RC **Chet Ensign** and **Gordon Sell** set a short windward leeward course that kept each race to about 20 minutes. At the end of each race they debriefed the sailors on what they saw happening, what was good and what could improve.

After their tentative first efforts on race 1, the sailors got the competitive spirit and started



"You could see improvement in the results," Chet said. "No one dominated the series and the winner really came down to the final race."

A few tips if you are travelling to NSC for the first time:

- Lake Nockamixon is located about 40 minutes from Spruce Run.
- Your GPS device of choice may provide some creative suggestions for how to get there via the back roads of Hunterdon County, however the consensus is that the quickest and safest route with boat in-tow is to take I-78 West to PA, and then take PA Route 611 South. From 611 South, turn right on Durham Rd (PA 412), and left on Mountain View Drive.
- There are multiple boat launches on Lake Nockamixon. Follow the signs for the Marina, and look for the blue and white NSC burgee on the sign posts!



Class Membership

Flying Scot sailors are strongly encouraged to join our class association, the Flying Scot Sailing Association (FSSA). Belonging to the FSSA supports the Flying Scot class, provides access to current information about Flying Scot sailing and events, includes a subscription to the *Scots n' Water* newsletter, and is required for participation in FSSA sanctioned regattas (such as this month's Atlantic Coast Championship, or next year's NACs, both held in nearby Toms River, NJ).

The FSSA is revising their fiscal year to better align with the sailing calendar. Previously, membership was September – August each year. Beginning in 2014, membership will be from January through December. Due to the change, members joining or renewing this September will receive 16 months of membership for the 12 month price. There is no better time to join the FSSA and support the Flying Scot class.

Jet-14 Fleet Report: Nationals Re-cap

Nicky Einthoven (1116) and **David Veno** (1150) represented the Hunterdon Sailing Club at the Jet-14 Nationals on Lake Norman in North Carolina August 8th -10th. Nicky and her crew Julia Tatiana (Carolina Sailing Club) did well taking 10th place in the Chevron division and brought home some hardware, actually, glassware! My son Justin and I had a good time (this being our first Nationals) and we came in 6th in the President's fleet, and 18th overall.

If you remember the Fo'c's'le last month, there was an article about the Flying Scot NACs, also held on Lake Norman in July. In it, Dave Petersen wrote that "..the Flying Scots were patiently waiting for any wind at all... most of Monday and Tuesday was spent sitting on a picnic bench in the shade staring at the AP flag!" Well, we did not have that problem! There were four straight days of winds, including the Jr.'s and Women's on the 7th, with the 9th being an event within an event... more about that later.

Nicky crewed for Meg Russell (Ashville Sailing Club) in the Women's championship. Meg, however, began to experience back problems and had to withdraw after two races. The event was sailed in a puffy southerly wind that varied from 4 - 12 kt. Cloud cover kept the temperatures down.

The open Nationals began in light southerly winds on the 8th. As the fleet finished the first race a moderate rain shower headed down the course and the race committee brought everyone in for lunch. After a couple of hours, we headed back out into even lighter winds. Thunderstorm clouds built up around the course and thunder rattled nearby, but the race #2 starting sequence began. The RC must have known what they were doing because the storms cleared and the winds picked up to 6-8 kt. We were able to complete three races in the afternoon.

The 9th was a gorgeous but hot summer day in a strong 10-14 kt southerly wind. Two races were held in the morning starting at 9:30 before we came in for a late lunch. We headed back out thinking that one or maybe two races would be held. The RC had other plans with three races on their agenda. The last race finished around 4:00. I overheard the RC communication with the chase boats and heard that the marks were about a half mile apart. That makes for some long races! **Brent Barbehenn** (now the National champion for 12 years) had a young junior sailor from LNYC as crew who admitted that he was tired at the start of the fifth race. Justin described the wind and water conditions the same as Barnegat Bay on a windy day. All skippers and crews were very tired at the end of the day, but how could you give up on strong winds in NC in August.

On the morning of final day of racing the winds were again out of the south at about 8-10 knots. Only one race was held to meet the advertised ten race regatta. For anyone keeping count, Nicky sailed in 12 races over a four day period – wow!

The racing instructions included some new things for me, an offset mark and a gate. There was a triangle course, but we only sailed it once. Justin and I liked the gate as a mark and think that HSC should consider a gate instead of a downwind mark. The regatta was very enjoyable and we look forward to next year's Nationals!
