ELIGIBILITY:

This event is open to all boats of the Day Sailer class. However DSA membership is required for Tri-Regional Championship award.

RACING:

There will be minimum 5 races scheduled. No race to begin after 12:00PM on Sunday. Sailing Instructions will be available at registration.

FLEETS:

There will be Championship Fleet and, if five or more boats register for it, a Presidential Fleet for competitors with little experience or racing without spinnaker. The separate start for Presidential Fleet is scheduled. This can be a good encouragement for our racing-shy Club members to make their appearance.

RULES:

Racing will be governed by the most recent version of THE RACING RULES OF SAILING of the US Sailing Association. Sailing Instructions will be available at registration.

SCORING:

The Low Point Scoring System of Appendix A of the Racing Rules of Sailing 1997-2000 will apply. The worst score will be discarded if five or more races are sailed.

AWARDS:

Keeper trophies will be presented to the top skippers and their crewmembers in both fleets (if applicable). There will be also a few surprise trophies for unsuspecting competitors.

FEES:

Registration fees and cost of the Saturday dinner will be included on the registration form. There will be a late fee for competitors registering after June 15th, 2000. Registration forms will be available for pick-up at Club every Sunday beginning on May 7th, or send by mail at request.

This article is to all NEW and Seasoned members that have not caught the racing bug. On July 15, 2000 (Saturday) HSC will host its first annual "ROOKIE REGATTA". You ask "What is a Rookie Regatta?" The Rookie Regatta will be for any member who has not skippered a race in a two-person sloop (Day Sailer, Albacore, Jet etc.) Next you say, "I don't have a boat". The club members will provide boats and an on-board help (that's the person who owns the boat!!) to sail with you. The races will be simple triangle courses. That means you sail upwind, hang a left at the mark (buoy in the water) and sail to the next mark and hang another left back to the downwind buoy and come around it to the start / finish line. Sounds easy!!!!

The finish times will be adjusted based on the type of boat that you sail in. What this means is that if everyone starts the race at the same time and you happen to be in an Albacore and someone else is in a Jet, then let's say that you cross the finish line and the Albacore beats the Jet by 30 seconds. Did you really beat the Jet??? That's why the race times will be adjusted. An Albacore is FASTER than a JET so you would most likely have to beat the Jet sailboat by more than 30 seconds.

So as a non-racing member, what do you have to do.

- 1) Have a desire to race in the Rookie Regatta on July 15th.
- 2) Mark your calendar "Rookie Regatta" at Spruce Run on July 15th.
- 3) Look for the Race Notice in your June Newsletter.
- Have a desire to have FUN. It doesn't matter if you Win or Lose, it matters that you gave it a try.

Skippers Meeting: 12 NOON

Race 1 - 1:30 PM followed by Race 2 and Race 3. There will only be ONE winner.

- Two people per boat + the on-board assistant (the owner).
- If you use your own boat then you don't have to have an on-board assistant but you do have to know what you are doing.

 Real racing rules will be in effect - e.g. Starboard / Port - The Starboard boat has "right of way".

Then we will return to the beach / launch area. Now more FUN !!

There will be a PICNIC (Hot Dogs / Hamburgers / Soda / Water) following the racing. Everyone atending must bring something like salads, deserts, chips & dips etc.

It's not over yet. HSC is also planning a SUNSET / Moonlight cruise (a cruise is not Racing). The SUNSET / Moonlight Cruise will take place on the evening of July 15th. You will see an announcement in the June / July Newsletters.

The COST for all of this FUN is only \$5.00 per person for the PICNIC. That's CHEAP but you will have to REGISTER for these events.









